


Wisdom Class Curriculum Map Summer Term 6 2026

History: Anglo-Saxons and Vikings

<p>English</p> <p>Wisdom will be looking at 'The Tale of Custard the Dragon' by Lynn Munsinger, as we prepared for the Burford dragon Festival. We will be using the text as a stimulus to discuss how authors use language and linguistic devices to create an effect. We will also be using it as a prompt for reading comprehension, especially focusing on the recall of information and on making inferences. Our writing targets are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write for different purposes including fiction and nonfiction, using appropriate layouts for the purpose. This will include writing with different 'voices' as the audience varies, using models from texts that we have read as inspiration for our writing. • Organise information using commas, paragraphs, adverbials and apostrophes. • Making links across paragraphs using conjunctions and fronted adverbials. 	<p>Maths</p> <p>This term, we will start by looking at key facts related to angles (obtuse, acute, right angle, 180 and 360 degrees) and using protractors to take and make accurate measurements</p> <p>We will also be looking at:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applying our understanding of calculation strategies in problem-solving, linked to real-life situations. • Practical maths activities linked to statistics, position, direction and shape. • Roman numerals up to 100 and 1,000. • Reading and writing time using analogue and digital clocks. • Continued work on fluent recall of number facts, including times tables. Making use of resources such as TTRS and mastering numer at Key Stage 2. <p>During Week 2, we will conduct the MTC which all Year 4s will need to complete.</p> 	
<p>History</p> <p>This term, we will study the Anglo-Saxon and Viking periods, linking back to our earlier study of Roman Britain. We will focus on specific artefacts such as the Sutton Hoo Ship burial and Alfred jewel and will ask questions to provoke critical thinking, such as 'Are we fair to the Vikings?'</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Our topic this term is Living Things and their habitats. The children will be working with Ms Brown to describe the life cycle of plants and animals and, hopefully, will be able to explore habitats using our renovated pond area! The children will also learn to recognise that environments can change and examine how this can create a danger and impact upon a variety of living things.</p>	
<p>PSHE</p> <p>This term's topic, is 'Changing Me'. Year 4 will consider basic elements of conception, changes that occur during puberty, primarily menstruation, as well as how life changes as they get older. Year 5 will learning about changes they experience through puberty, both in boys and girls as well as conception. To see further information, please see the recent email regarding this RSE topic.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>At the beginning of the term, art lessons will centre around the creation of 3D mixed-media dragon for the Burford festival! Later in the term, the class will explore the work of environmental artists in 3D studies of endangered animals.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>Children will continue with cornet lessons with Mr Gray throughout the term.</p>
<p>Computing</p> <p>Both year groups will learn to use photo-editing software through the use of Photopea. They will learn to use the software to complete basic functions such as rotating, resizing and cropping. As ever, pupils will learn about online-safety.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>With Mrs Turner, we will be exploring the key question: How do inspirational people impact on how Humanists live today?</p>	
<p>MFL</p> <p>We will learn Spanish vocabulary related to important dates, as well as animals. Following this we will review the learning from the year. Year 5 will build on Spanish work done last year and consider pronunciation and use in sentences.</p>	<p>PE</p> <p>On Tuesdays, pupils will learn athletics skills with the school's sports coach in preparation for sports day and then changing to cricket following. Within class PE lessons, the children will be learning golf skills.</p>
